A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, DIANA LINKOUS

Our Warren County Genealogical Society would like to give a big THANK YOU for all the interest and support given to us this year through your memberships, donations, and projects. We reached a high of 296 members in over 40 states. Your support for the project of Digitization of the War of 1812 pensions was phenomenal. Your donations have totaled over \$1800.00 and we have matched the amount of \$500.00 that we set in January of 2015.

Our volunteers have worked in a variety of areas. Updating the Funeral Home Records is in progress. Obituaries continue to be clipped from the local papers. And since so many obits are online only, we have collected them from 6 Funeral Home's online notices for additional indexes. Cemetery records are continuing to be collected, with many new pictures posted on the Virtual Cemetery Tour. Some County School Records from the 1930's are being indexed, birth records copied, and more complete death records are being entered. We thank our volunteers for their time given to all our projects, as well as staffing the library. We welcome any interested new volunteers. There are opportunities to help with ongoing projects as well as new ones, or even just working on you family tree.

We are excited to announce the purchase of a new digital microfilm machine and computer system dedicated to running it. The ST Viewscan III system can handle 16 and 35 mm microfilm, microfiche and negatives. The images can be easily sent to the printer, saved to USB, Google Drive, Dropbox or email, etc.

35 YEARS!!! Yes, the Warren County Genealogical Society will celebrate its 35th anniversary this year. This society has grown and changed in so many ways. Our charter members would be amazed at all that has been accomplished. We began with a project to publish an every name index for the History of Warren County, Ohio by Beers, writing each name on an index card, alphabetizing them, and sending it out for publication. Member Betty Greer crocheted an afghan for a money making raffle. Our first early book purchases traveled in a box in someone's car. And our first office was a small room in the old Court House on Silver Street. The members placed the stacks of pages of our Heir Lines Quarterly on the table and marched around it, collating the pages, before stapling, and addressing the issues.

Since then, our members / volunteers have helped to preserve a number of records, indexed, abstracted, transcribed, and published many books. We have entered many records into databases for our web site as well as office use. We have a wonderful room for our library located on the lower floor in the New County Administration Building on Justice Drive, Lebanon, Ohio. We welcome researchers to our library. Our staff will help visitors with computer use, finding resources on our shelves, and in our files. Our volunteers continue to be our greatest resource, making it all possible. Thanks for a great year!

The State of Ohio, Warren County

War. Com. Pleas, April Term 1834 Application for Naturalization

On the 21st day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four personally appeared in open court **Alexander Crawford** and applicant for naturalization who on being duly sworn according to law deposeth and saith that it is his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States of America, that he will support the constitution of the United States, that he doth hereby absolutely and entirely renounces and abjures all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty whatever an particularly he renounces all allegiance and fidelity to his majesty William the IV. King of the United Kingdoms of Great Britain, Ireland, Scotland &c. to whom he was heretofore a subject; and the said Alexander Crawford also saith that he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the order of nobility in any country whatever and further saith not.

Sworn to & subscribed in open court this day & year aforesaid.

=> WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILES:

In December, the pension files for Ohio on line at Fold3 again stop at that for **Simeon Moore** as has been the case for many months now. We know of about 83 pension files containing 2,977 pages that have been digitized for soldiers with a connection to Warren County.

Michael Bannon (1788-1870) - no pension file was found.

- Warren County, Ohio Marriage records 1803-1852 vol. 1 page 72 image 344 of 556 # 555 Michael Bannon and Nancy Clark were married 31 Dec 1812 by P. Kitchel J.P.
- Private Michael Bannon is listed on the Roll of Captain <u>Theophilus Simonton's Company</u> which served from March 23, to October 1, 1813.
- From Beers History of Warren County page 716, The Methodist Episcopal Church at Deerfield is built upon ground donated to the society by William Heaton in 1827. The trustees of the society, at the time of the execution of the deed of gift by William and Rachel Heaton, were William Worley, William Vannote, George Wager, George Foglesong, James Clark, Michael Banon, Brice Worley, John Shephard and Ephraim Ludlum. "Ohio, County
- Bounty Land Warrant #409 for 80 acres under the Act of 1850 issued in favor of Michael Bannon, Private in <u>Captain Simingtons Company</u>, Colonel Millers Regiment Ohio Militia, War of 1812. He assigned it to James P. Crouse who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Pulaski County, Kentucky of 3 Mar 1859.
- Bounty Land Warrant #4039 for 80 acres under the Act of 1855 issued in favor of Michael Bannon, Private in Captain Symington's Company of Ohio Militia, War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to John Dever who assigned it to David Putman who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Guthrie County, Iowa on 1 Sep 1857

married Nancy Clark 31 Dec 1812 at Warren County, Ohio

died 3 Feb 1870, Deerfield, Randolph County, Indiana

Chester F. Mack, Jr. became member #14 of First Families of Warren County in 1986 by proving his descent from Michael Bannon and Elizabeth Clark who were proven to be in Deerfield Township by 1812.

Complete pension files are now on line for widow certificate numbers up to about 148,100.

The pension file for **Dr. Francis Dunlevy Morris** was located in the last month.

Elizabeth Y. Reeder (Certificate #40399) widow of Dr. Francis D. Morris, 35th OVI [31 images]

Francis Dunlevy Morris was the son of <u>Jacob Morris</u> (1799-1868) and **Jane Burnett Dunlevy** (1803-1842). His mother was the daughter of <u>Judge Francis Dunlavy</u> and **Mary Burnet Craig**. He was married to **Elizabeth Yeatman Reeder** by Rev. **William MacMillan** on 7 Jul 1859 in Butler County, Ohio. They had one child, **Francis D. Morris Jr.** born 19 Aug 1863 in Butler County.

Francis D. Morris, age 30, first served as the Assistant Surgeon in the 19th O.V.I. (3 months) from 13 May to 31 Aug 1861. He was commissioned as Assistant Surgeon in the <u>35th O.V.I.</u> on 24 Sep 1861, received a disability discharge on 6 Aug 1862 and reenlisted on 1 Nov 1863 when he was promoted to Surgeon. The doctor contracted chronic diarrhea at Kennesaw, Georgia on 1 Jun 1864, was still suffering from the disease at Chattanooga on 25 Aug 1864. While home on sick leave he contracted erysipelas and died at Hamilton on 21 Sep 1864 while in the care of **Dr. Joseph L. McNeeley**.

on 4 Oct 1864, **Elizabeth Y. Morris** of Hamilton, made a declaration in Butler County Probate court for the purpose of obtaining a widow's pension under the Act of 1862 (Application #70242). She was awarded a pension of \$25 per month commencing 21 Sep 1864 by Certificate #40399 dated 7 Feb 1865. She received an additional \$2 per month commencing 25 Jul 1866 for her son **Francis D. Morris** until he reached the age of 16 on 18 Aug 1879. She was living at 18 Beach Street in Walnut Hills, Cincinnati, when applying for a pension increase on 12 Sep 1873. Her brother-in-law, <u>W. J. Morris</u> attested to her Walnut Hills residence with her child Francis D. Morris. She was last paid \$25 to 4 Jun 1895 and dropped from the rolls due to her death on 19 Aug 1895 as reported by **Frank D. Morris** of Mt. Auburn, Ohio.

Supporting testimony for her claim was given by **Caroline A. Follin**, over 30, of Newport, Campbell County, Kentucky; **Nathanial S. Reeder**, over 25, of Kemper Lane, Walnut Hills. It is believed that they were Elizabeth's siblings. Other testimony was provided by **General Van Derver** and Major **Joseph L. Budd**.
