Thomas R. Foley (January 13, 1918 – July 29, 2016)

We are saddened by the passing of Tom Foley – husband of our long time Treasurer, Harriet Foley. Tom was a World War II veteran and retired and chief engineer at Armco. Tom and Harriet have been WCGS members for over 30 years. In that time, Tom has served our society in innumerable different ways. The layout and drawings of our resource library was his work. He also drew the series of 5 Warren County Township Formation Maps which are a great help in determining where your early ancestors lived. Tom and Harriet have always been a regular at our monthly society meetings. Tom and Harriet co-authored the 317-page book, "The Foleys from County Clare, Ireland" in 1994 and they have been issuing regular updates to the book ever since. Through their efforts, Foley family reunions have been held on a bi-annual basis for many years, either in Ireland or in the USA. War, Com. Pleas The State of Ohio Warren County Oct. Term 1828 Application for naturalization

On this sixth day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, Personally appeared in open Court, Joseph Henderson an applicant for naturalization, who being duly sworn according to Law, deposeth and Saith, that it is his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States of America; That he will support the Constitution of the United States, that he doth hereby absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, State of sovereignty whatever, and particularly he renounces all allegiance and fidelity to his Majesty the King of Great Britain and Ireland &c. whom he was heretofore a subject; And the said Joseph Henderson also Saith that he has never born any hereditary title or been of any of the order of nobility in any country whatever, and further he saith not.

Irnie Witherow Kirkpatrick being duly sworn upon her oath says that her maiden name was Irnie Witherow and that she was born on July 5, 1879 in Springboro, Warren County State of Ohio, her parents being George Witherow and Ollie Lewellen Witherow.

And affiant says that the record of her birth is incorrect as her given name is "Irnie" instead of Irwin as stated in said record and affiant makes this affidavit to have said record corrected to show her name to be "Irnie Witherow" instead of Irwin Witherow. That she has always gone by the name Irnie and that is the name her parents gave her and called her, and she is certain that the mistake was made in recording her name. That her insurance policies, social security number and all legal documents are made out in the name of "Irnie" and therefore she asks that the record be so corrected. That her parents are now deceased and that she is the oldest child of said George and Ollie Witherow. That said birth is recorded in Vol. 1 Page 262 of the Records of Births in the Probate Court of Warren County, Ohio.

Further affiant sayeth not.

GRAND ARMY OF THE REBUBLIC, JOHN KELL POST 241, FRANKLIN, OHIO

The Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) was a fraternal organization founded in 1866. Membership was restricted to Union veterans (Army, Navy, Marines) of the Civil War. The GAR was organized by state (called Departments) and then by local Posts. The Woman's Relief Corps " (WRC) was recognized in 1883 as the official women's auxiliary to the GAR.

The Department of Ohio included the following posts located in Warren County

- Granville Thurston Post No. 213, Lebanon, chartered May 13, 1882
 - o Women's Relief Corp No. 97 auxiliary instituted October 15, 1885
 - o Granville Thurston Relief Corps No. 199, Lebanon, instituted November 18, 1902
- W. R. Hoel Post No. 230, Waynesville, chartered January 17, 1885
- John Kell Post No. 241, Franklin, chartered June 29, 1882
- Sullivan Stevens Post No. 353, Morrow, organized August 18, 1883
- Billy Baner/Bainer Post No. 537, Springboro, organized August 10, 1885
- Holdman Post No. 608, Hageman
- John Scott Post No. 688, Mason.

From page 315-316 of The Military History of Ohio: Warren County Edition (New York: H. H. Hardesty, 1886)

"John Kell Post No. 241 was chartered in Franklin, Ohio, on 29 Jun 1882. It is named for Colonel John Kell, late of the Second Ohio Volunteer Infantry. Sprung from a line of soldiers, having himself been in the Mexican war, of a high spirit and dauntless courage, John Kell was fitted to be a leader of volunteers of '61. Enrolling Company F, First Ohio, for three months' service, with a pledge "to be in the struggle to its end," he joined early friends in organizing the Second Ohio Volunteer Infantry, three years, becoming its lieutenant-colonel. His service ending with his fall at Stone River, summed up the best results of a strong, resolute manhood.

Bone, E. Bridge, H. Y. Rush, Joseph M'Carty, I. N. Snell, J. C. Brown, J. B. Woodward, J. H. Thompson, A. S. Reeder, W. W. Decker, John M'Nellis, B. F. Archdeacon, John Sheedy, Ed. M. Meeker, Jacob Cautle, L. Meckling, J. L. Ingraham, J. S. Johnston, T. C. Hatfield, S. G. Schenck, H. F. Vandevere, Ed. Crawford, B. F. Anderson, J. R. Sweeney, Joseph Wear, A. B. Spader, J. P. Deardoff, Charles Brown, W. W. Whiting, W. F. Hailman, H. Bennett, A. F. Meeker, Ben Morgan, John G. Gage, John Bridge, J. W. Dakion."
