WESTERN STAR NEWSPAPERS NOW ON-LINE THROUGH 1922.

Jenni Salamon of the Ohio History Center has informed us that our **Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project**, has been expanded to make searchable digital images of the Western Star available on-line for free from 1807 through 1922. These digital images were created from original copies of the newspaper located at the Ohio History Center in Columbus.

The Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project is sponsored and maintained by the Warren County Genealogical Society. Using digitization and OCR technology, it provides free public access to nearly 27,000 pages of this historical newspaper. The project has had 450 users who have viewed 11,413 pages through 31 Dec 2018. This project was made possible through the generosity of her son and daughter-in-law, **J. Todd and Rebecca Stephenson**.

Recently, we were given a few complete issues of Western Star publication. These are a great addition to our collection of Warren County information. We would like to expand this collection. The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3. This phase covers surnames from "Moore" through the letter Q. Pension files for men who served in Ohio Militia Units are now on line through the name **John Puffenberger**. Previously, pension files were located for the following Warren County soldiers:

Pvt. James Perrine (1773-1864) in Capt. Daniel Kain's Company Oho Militia (20 pages)

HELP: It was originally thought this was the James Perrine (1786-1872) buried in <u>Fellowship Cemetery</u> but a review of the pension file shows the James Perrine who served Capt. Kain's Company was from Clermont County. Can anyone provide information on any War of 1812 service by the James Perrine (1786-1872) who is buried in the <u>Fellowship Cemetery?</u>

Pvt. Zachariah Prater, Capts. Curtis' and Cunningham's Companies (20 pages)

Pvt. Peter S. Price, Capt. L. Leonard's Co. Ohio Militia (34 pages

PRIVATE WILLIAM PHILLIPS (ca. 1790-1860) WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE

War of 1812 Pension and Bounty Land Warrant Application Files," fold3.com, William Phillips (37 pages)

William Phillips and Harriet J. Hoar were married on 5 Jun 1851 by Rev. Wm. Herr at Urbana, Champaign County, Ohio. William Phillips died 6 Jan 1860 at Urbana, Champaign County, Ohio. Harriett died on 19 Apr 1885.

- William Phillips was drafted at Lebanon, Ohio for a term as 6 months, as a Private in Captain Matthias Corwin's Company in Col. David Sutton's 1st Regiment Ohio Militia on 11 Aug 1812, a short time after Hull's surrender at Detroit. He was honorably discharged at St. Marys, Ohio, on 11 Feb 1813. Anthony Howard Dunlevy gave a detailed account of the company while in the service. His testimony was attested to by Job Wright, Court Clerk
- On 8 Nov 1850, **William Phillips** aged 60 of Urbana Twp, Champaign County, Ohio, made a declaration before **Nelson Rhodes**, J.P. for the purpose of obtaining bounty land under the Act of 1850. **Moses B. Corwin & J. C. Phillips** attested to his service. Bounty Land Warrant No. 13078 for 80 acres was issued under the Act of 1850 to **William Phillips**, Private Capt. Corwin's Company Ohio Militia. He was issued a patent for 80 acres in Putnam County, Missouri on 9 Jan 1854.
- On 28 Apr 1855, **William Phillips**, aged 65, of Champaign County, Ohio, made a declaration before a **Nelson Rhodes**, J.P. for the purpose of obtaining additional bounty land under the Act of 1855. **Moses B. Corwin** witnessed his declaration. <u>Bounty Land Warrant No. 26745</u> for 80 acres was issued under the Act of 1850 to **William Phillips**, Private Captain Corwin's Company Ohio Militia War 1812. He assigned the warrant to **Jacob Hersch** who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Franklin County, Iowa on 15 Apr 1859
- On 18 Jun 1878, **Harriett J. Phillips**, aged 78, of Bellefontaine, Logan County, Ohio, made a declaration before the Logan County Common Pleas Court Clerk for the purpose of obtaining a widow's pension under the Act of 1878. Her declaration was witnessed by **Cassius F. & Maggie E. Martin**. She was awarded a pension of \$8 per month commencing 9 Mar 1878 by Certificate No. 19211 dated 21 Feb 1879. She was last paid \$8 to 4 Mar 1885 and was dropped from the rolls on 21 May 1885 due to her death.
