NEW LINEAGE SOCIETY - CIVIL WAR FAMILIES OF WARREN COUNTY, OHIO

As previously announced at the Warren County Genealogical Society’s 2018 Annual Banquet in April, we are pleased to offer another lineage society for membership. The Civil War Families of Warren County’s goal is to identify and honor the memory of those soldiers, whether Union or Confederate, who served during the Civil War and who lived, died or are buried in Warren County, Ohio.

As with the other lineage societies offered by WCGS, descendants must be a member of the Warren County Genealogical Society, complete an application that identifies either a direct or collateral ancestor who lived, died, or is buried in Warren County. Along with supporting documentation that traces the applicant’s ancestry back to the veteran, sufficient evidence of the veteran’s service in the Civil War must accompany the application. Applications are due by February 1st each year. The Society is currently accepting applications for the first induction which will be held during the WCGS Annual Banquet in the spring of 2019.

The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3. This phase will cover surnames from “Moore” through the letter Q. Pension files for men who served in Ohio Militia Units are now on line through the name **Matthew Patten**.

=>PRIVATE JOHN PERRIN MARCH, WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE

John P. March was born in Gloucester County, Virginia on 27 February 1794. He was married to **Sarah Hundley** on 23 December 1822 by Rev. **John Brownly** in Mathews County, Virginia at the Hundley homestead, then occupied by her brother **Thomas Hundley**. **Joseph Bohannon** (born 12 Sep 1807) who lived a few hundred yards from the Hundley homestead,

stated that he attended the wedding in the company of the late **Thomas Terry**. John and Sarah lived in Mathews County for about nine years when they moved with their three children to Lebanon, Ohio in 1831. A fourth child was born in Lebanon in 1831 and died young. John died at Lebanon on 16 Oct 1857. Sarah died on 3 May 1893. They and their four children are all buried in the Old Section of Lebanon Cemetery.

John P. March enlisted as a Private at Gloucester, Gloucester County, Virginia in Capt. **Robert Thurston's** Company on 16 Feb 1813 and served 3 months and 8 days to 23 Mar 1814.

On 8 May 1851, **John P. March**, age, 57, of Warren County, made a declaration before **Benjamin Blackburn** a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of obtaining Bounty Land under the Act of 1850. He declared that he served as a Private in Captain **Robert Thurston's** Company in the 21st Regiment of Virginia Militia commanded by Col. **William Jones**. He volunteered in the spring of 1813 in Gloucester County, Virginia as a frontier guard and continued in active service until the close of the war in the latter part of 1814 with the exception of times when at home on parole when he was required to take up arms at the firing of a signal gun. [Bounty Land Warrant No. 48451](#) for 40 acres was issued under the Act of 1850 in favor of John P. March Private in Captain Thurston's Company 21st Regiment, Virginia Militia War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to **Mark E. Reeves** and **James Pullan** who were issued a patent for 40 acres in Starke County, Indiana on 1 Apr 1854.

On 11 Apr 1855, **John P. March** of Warren County, aged 61 on the 27 day of February last, made a declaration before **James D. Blackburn**, Justice of the Peace for the purpose of obtaining bounty land under the Act of 1855. He declared that he volunteered as a Private in Captain **Robert Thurston's** Company in a regiment commanded by Colonel **William Jones** and was honorably discharged at the close of the War. He indicated that the company was changed into a Rifle Company and his service in the company was not constant but he was in actual service more than three months. [Bounty Land Warrant No. 31327](#) for 120 acres was issued under the Act of 1855 in favor of John P. March Private in Captain Thurston's Company, Virginia Militia War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to **John Perrine** and **James H. Perrine** who were issued a patent for 120 acres in Ringgold County, Iowa on 1 Jul 1859.

On 13 May 1878, **Sarah March**, age 75, of Lebanon, gave a declaration before Warren County Clerk of Courts, **Lot Wright**, for the purpose of obtaining a widow's pension under the Act of 1878. She declared that she was the widow of **John P. March** who volunteered at Gloucester Co, VA as a private in the company commanded by Captain **Thomas Cary** in the 21st regiment of Virginia Militia commanded by Col. **William Jones** and served about 34 days. Sarah said that her husband was 18 years of age in February 1812 and a carriage maker by occupation who was born in Gloucester County Virginia. Supporting testimony was provided by **John E. Dey**, age 86 and Dr. **Adam Sellers**, age 76 (their family physician). Sarah was unable to furnish a certified record of her marriage to John P. March as the records of Mathews County, Virginia were destroyed during the Civil War. She presented a family bible bearing the date 1828 which had an entry made by her husband John P. March sometime prior to 1831 which read "*John P. March was married to Sarah Hundley the 23rd day of December 1833.*" Sworn statements confirming their marriage were made by Mathews County residents **Joseph Bohannon**, age 70, Mrs. **Joice Lewis**, age 81, and **William Stoakes**, age 69 (an apprentice in John's coach making shop who purchased the business when the March family moved to Lebanon). **Sarah March** was admitted to a pension of \$8 per month commencing 9 Mar 1878 by certificate No. 7051 dated 13 Jun 1878. She was last paid \$12 to 4 March 1893 and dropped from the rolls due to her death at Lebanon, Ohio on 3 May 1893.

We now know of about 99 pension files containing 3,319 pages that have been digitized for soldiers with a connection to Warren County.
