Close to home, on Wednesday, September 10, 2025, we are hosting a delightful evening via Zoom with Paige Craig, President of the Clermont County Genealogical Society. Around us, the Clermont, Hamilton, and Montgomery Chapters have all announced upcoming events on their websites. If you are not already members of these Societies, you should consider joining. Also, if you are local, don't miss the <u>55th Annual Dayton Book Fair</u>, being held at the new Montgomery County Fairgrounds at 645 Infirmary Road in Dayton, on Friday, November 7, through Sunday, November 9, 2025.

In previous issues of *e-News*, we have presented accolades to FamilySearch for their beta Full-Text Search option. FamilySearch has now added Full-Text to their regular toolbox, and it is available under the Search tab on their home page, and they are continuing to add new documents at a rapid pace.

Newspapers.com (requires paid subscription) announced they have added 482 newspapers to their collection, including 11 Ohio papers. You can see the list on their blog post of August 20, 2025: <u>Explore 482 New Papers!</u>

Hardly a day goes by when I don't think about our volunteers. Thanks to them, we are the only genealogical society in Southwest Ohio fortunate enough to have a research library of our own, open five days a week. In addition to manning the library and phones, these volunteers work tirelessly to update our records, handle the business of the Society, take care of Research Requests, and process materials donations that often include books, binders, files, periodicals, office supplies, and other treasures. The number of hours involved is staggering! The efforts of these volunteers to stay on top of these things is much appreciated by all, but in particular, I would like to thank those working to keep current on our collection of obituaries, updating our cemetery records and master indexes, and consolidating records into a massive database that we fondly call the Warren County Ohio Big Tree. Every volunteer spending time on these projects makes it easier for you, the researcher, to get information about your Warren County ancestors.

On a sad note, our old website is no longer online. Efforts are being made to see if it can be resurrected, but we recognize that may not be possible. Please see the article from Jo Roth for more details and information on the effort to update and transfer what we can to our current website.

It won't surprise you that we have more potential projects than we have time and volunteers available. If you are interested in jumping in to help us, please let me know.

Our Main Website

As of August 2025, our original website (wcgsoh.org / wcgsoh-old.org), which launched Spring 2002 and was kindly hosted (at no cost to us) on the county servers, seems to be gone. With the recent revamp of the county email addresses and website URLs, our website was not carried over to the new format. We have lost a GREAT resource of information. Please follow the progress of our work to get more information from the old site added to our new site.

Our new website (wcgsohio.org) was launched late June 2021, and has allowed us to share news with those interested, information about our Society, events, and programs, and begin building a research resource for those connected to Warren County. It has allowed our members to join or renew WCGS online using a credit card or PayPal account, supporters to donate quickly and easily, and customers to purchase our publications and used books for sale.

We have now constructed a dedicated <u>Warren County Research</u> page and will be linking new website pages and PDFs as they are completed. The use of PDFs allows more of our volunteers to participate in the building and updating of this information and even better, allows you to print and / or download and save the topics that interest you! We hope you find it helpful.



Daniel Hobbs Cable (November 29, 1945 – January 28, 2025)

WCGS Member and Supporter with his late wife Martha Jean "Mardy" (Dumford) Cable



Daniel Hobbs Cable passed away on January 28, 2025, at the age of 79 in Littleton, Colorado. He is survived by his daughter, Mollie Moltzau; and his grandchildren, Kathryn Moltzau, Matthew Moltzau, and Daniel Moltzau. He is also survived by his siblings, Margaret Wittrock, William Cable, and June Essing.

Daniel was born on November 29,1945, in West Lafayette, Indiana, to Raymond Millard and Mary Caswell "Tommy" (Tupper) Cable. Dan was born naturally curious, loved building things, and spent time launching rockets in the backyard and setting off cherry bombs with friends. In high school he studied science, played the trumpet, was the drum major, and played in a dance band. In 1963 he won the local science fair and went to the National Science Fair winning 3rd place overall.

Daniel attended Purdue University for his undergraduate work. The Vietnam War interrupted his education and Dan volunteered for the draft and joined the Army. After basic training, he went to Signals training and ended up breaking the code for the SIGABA coding machine and got punished for it by his immediate chain of command. His superior officers recognized his intelligence and promoted him to teach the class! They also kept him stateside, hoping to recruit him to the Pentagon. He served with distinction and was honorably discharged.

In 1969 Dan returned to Purdue to finish his degree in Electrical Engineering. There he met the love of his life, Martha Dumford, at a house party and were married 9 months later in August of 1970. They began their marriage with a cross-country road trip honeymoon, full of misadventures and fun to go live in Arizona. Their daughter Mollie was born two years later and Dan loved being a dad. Dan attended Arizona State University for his graduate work in Physics in search of answers about this universe. Ultimately his thesis was denied, so he joined the workforce. Dan worked for Goodyear Aerospace, Loral Defense Systems, and Lockheed Martin over his career. Dan was proud of his work on various radar systems. He worked on the SR-71 Blackbird, Bi-static radar, and Lidar. In 1994 Dan won the prestigious NOVA Award for Technical Excellence. The award read: For world-renowned expertise on Synthetic Aperture Radar image formation processing algorithm development.

Dan and Mardy lived in the West Valley for 44 years.

Dan's life goal was to take his graduate thesis and write a book about physics. He wanted to show how Science and Quantum Physics proves the existence of God, the Creator of the Universe, and how those two things are not mutually exclusive. The manuscript never did get finished, but he sure enjoyed working on it and pondering great questions of life, physics, and math. He said, "If I don't finish it, I will die happy trying to."

Dan and Mardy moved to Colorado in 2014 to be closer to their daughter and grandchildren, whom they deeply loved. Dan and Mardy were able to celebrate 52 beautiful years together. We will miss his kind and generous heart, and goofy sense of humor. Daniel was a man of deep faith and loved God. He often said, "I not only believe in miracles, I rely upon them." He is now reunited with Mardy in heaven.

Joe was born on June 16, 1943, in Cincinnati, Ohio, to the late Dr. Joseph Doran, Sr., and the late Doris (Gustin) Doran. He was also preceded in death by his siblings: Richard Doran of Denver, Colorado; Michael Doran of Hartsville, South Carolina; Sally Lecon of Las Vegas, Nevada; and David Doran of Lake Delton, Wisconsin. Joe spent his early years living across from and attending Orange Schools in Moreland Hills, Ohio, where he graduated high school in 1961. He went on to attend Boston University and later returned to Cleveland where he graduated from John Carroll University, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1966. Joe later achieved his Master in Social Work degree from Case Western Reserve University, which he leveraged to fulfill a long and successful career as an adult therapist with Catholic Social Services of Cuyahoga County, Ohio. On November 27, 1967, Joe married Carlotta Creech and they spent their early years raising their three children in Shaker Heights and Solon, Ohio. In retirement, Joe and Carlotta moved to Charlotte, North Carolina, to be close to and spend cherished time with their daughters and grandchildren. Joe was a sports enthusiast, rooting on and showing unwavering support for community and local sports teams and had a love for travel, especially his yearly trip to Minnesota to fish the boundary waters with his brothers. Later in life, Joe developed a passion for genealogy and piecing together his family roots which served him well as he played the role of connecting and bringing people together, most notably his high school friends and his favorite local lunch buddies. Anyone that met Joe quickly became a lifelong friend and those friendships were treasured deeply by him.

Inurnment took place Saturday, May 25, 2024, at Lake View Cemetery in Cleveland, Ohio. 
