WARREN COUNTY MILITARY HERITAGE

CRAMPTON BROTHERS – CIVIL WAR VETERANS.

It appears that **Harvey Crampton** and **Hiram Crampton** (1842-1916) are probably brothers who served in different regiments from Warren County during the Civil War.

HARVEY CRAMPTON (1829-1906)

Harvey Crampton, thought to be the son of **Joel Crampton** and **Eleanor Ross** (and brother of **Hiram Crampton**) was born Aug 1829 in Ohio. Harvey Crampton Jr. and **Anna Crist** were issued a marriage license in Warren County on 14 Nov 1857. No Marriage return was located but Harvey and Anna appear together in the 1860, 1870 and 1880 census in Franklin Township and Anna is listed as the wife of Harvey Crampton on her gravestone. Anna Crampton died on 10 Jun 1888 and is buried in Woodhill Cemetery in Franklin Twp. (Sec. 5 Lot 62-2) along with three of her seven children.

Harvey Crampton enlisted as a 32-year-old 1st Lieutenant on 7 Oct 1861 and was mustered into Co F, 75th OVI on 14 Dec 1861 with many other Franklin Township men. Harvey resigned his commission in West Virginia on 15 May 1862 due to illness (hernia).

Harvey enlisted on 2 May 1864 and was commissioned a Captain and commanding officer of the 146th OVI. The 146th was one of many 100-day units and had over 350 Warren County men. Hiram was mustered out with the regiment at Camp Dennison, Ohio on 7 Sep 1864.

Harvey Crampton filed for an invalid pension on 13 Nov 1886 (Application No. 589208, Certificate No. 817138) for service in Co F 75th OVI and F&S 146th OVI Infantry regiments.

Harvey Crampton was admitted to the Western Branch of the National Military Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers in Leavenworth Kansas on 26 Aug 1886 and died at the home hospital on 20 Jul 1906. He is buried in Sec 21 Row 5 Site 27 at the Leavenworth National Cemetery in Leavenworth, Kansas. At the time of his admission, home records list him as a married carpenter residing in Kansas City, MO and lists Hiram Crampton of Kansas City as his nearest relative.

HIRAM CRAMPTON (1842-1916)

Hiram Crampton was born in Warren County on 23 May 1842, the son of Joel and Eleanor Crampton and brother of **Harvey Crampton**. In 1869 he moved to Kansas City, Missouri and on 3 Sep 1872 he married **Rosa Belle Lyons** in Jackson County Missouri.

Hiram Crampton enlisted as a 20-year-old Private on 11 Aug 1862 and was mustered into Co F, 79th OVI on 29 Aug 1862. Well over 430 Warren County men served in the 79th OVI. On 4 Aug 1865 Hiram was discharged from the 79th for promotion and was commissioned a 1st Lieutenant in Company D, 44th US Colored Infantry Regiment. He was mustered out with the regiments on 30 Apr 1866. On 29 Oct 1867, Hiram was appointed to the rank of Brevet Captain for his service during the Battle of Nashville on 15 & 16 Dec 1864. Papers filed in conjunction with his appoint indicate that he was mustered in as a 2nd lieutenant on 12 Jun 1864 and promoted to 1st lieutenant on 14 Aug 1865.

Hiram filed for an invalid pension on 14 Jun 1904 and again on 5 Sept. 1907 (Application #1318503, Certificate #1086438) for service in Co F, 79th OVI and Co D, 44th USCT. Hiram died 13 Nov 1916 at the home of his daughter, **Laura "Daisy" Moise** in Kansas City, MO. Hiram was buried in the Elmwood Cemetery along with his wife and daughter, Laura. His obituary indicates that he was past commander of the Grand Army of the Republic Farragut-Thomas Post No. 8 and a member of a member of the Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States (MOLLUS).

(Hiram was included in the book "**Franklin Township in the American Civil War**" by Geoffrey G. Gorsuch but was not in our WCGS database of Warren County Civil War Soldiers.)
