NECROLOGY – SUE ANNE FRARY

We were saddened to learn of the recent death of Sue Anne Frary, a longtime supporter and member of the Warren County Genealogical Society. Sue became a member of the society about 1992 while still a resident of Cincinnati and continued as a member through 2010. She served as 1st Vice President in 2004. During that time, she was active in a number of projects involving the history of Otterbein Lebanon where she and her husband Bill had moved to. She worked on Shaker records and resources found at both Otterbein and elsewhere. Sue worked with Otterbein to add the interments in the Otterbein-Lebanon Cemetery to our Warren County Virtual Cemetery Project. Sue and Bill had an interest in the Civil War. In 2002, WCGS published a 174-page book titled "Civil War Soldiers Buried in Warren County" that was compiled by Sue. Her research resulted in a database of 1,415 Civil War Soldiers buried in Warren County that is arranged as an alphabetical listing, by cemetery, section & lot. Each entry contains the soldier's name, rank, unit, service dates and date of birth & death. An every name index was included at the end of the book which WCGS still has available in our publication catalog. In addition to her work on these projects, Sue was a regular volunteer staffing our Resource Library.

Sue was born May 29, 1929 and passed away on June 13, 2018. She will be missed. It is our understanding that final arrangements are pending at the Ogle & Paul R. Young Funeral Home in Oxford, Ohio with her ashes to be scattered in the scatter garden in the Otterbein-Lebanon Cemetery.

CINCINNATI PIONEER ASSOCIATION

The Hamilton County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society [HCGS] published an article by Bev Breitenstein and Jeff Herbert in the December 2017 edition of The Tracer, "Cincinnati Pioneer Association". The following is extracted from the article.

"The Cincinnati Pioneer Association was organized at the Dennison House, Cincinnati, Ohio, November 23, 1856 - its members having had a residence in Ohio on or before the Fourth of July 1812." ¹ The fee to join was one dollar payable to the secretary of the association. An amendment in 1872 permitted those who were in Ohio prior to 4 July 1815 to become members on payment of a two-dollar fee to the secretary.

The article contains a long list of association members that were extracted from a 6-volume series of bulletins published by the Society. The membership list continues in the March and June 2018 editions of The Tracer and included 15 members connected to Warren County. An asterisk * next to the name indicates that the person was deceased in April 1885. A double asterisk **indicates the member was already deceased in 1873

WARREN COUNTY MILITARY HERITAGE http://goo.gl/uWutD =>CAPTAIN DANIEL CUSHING, WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILES:

The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3. This phase will cover surnames from "Moore" through the letter Q. Pension files for men who served in Ohio Militia Units are now on line through the name **Elihu Parker**. We noted one file with a Warren County connection.

War of 1812 Pension and Bounty Land Warrant Application Files," digital image, fold3.com, Daniel Cushing (36 images)

- Daniel Lewis Cushing was probably born in New Jersey about 1761. He was married to Margaret Van Horne by her father, Reverend William Van Horne in his home in Scotch Plains, New Jersey. They had five known children: William, Ann, Courtland, Hannah and Clara/Clarissa Cushing. In 1807 the family migrated to Warren County, Ohio. On 2 Jul 1812 at the age of about 51, Daniel entered the service at Lebanon as a Captain in the 2nd regiment, US Artillery. On the 24th of March 1815 he drowned while crossing the River Auglaize in the state of Ohio "whilst in the line of his duty, marching at the head of his company." His widow, Margaret Cushing was awarded a Half Pay Pension of \$20 per month under the Act of 16 Apr 1816. Margaret lost her pension when she was remarried to John Halsey in 1819. John died in 1845 and is buried in the Baptist Graveyard in Lebanon. Margaret died in 1860 and is buried by her second husband in the Baptist Graveyard.
- On 30 Oct 1850, **Mrs. Harriet Ross**, aged 67, of Warren County, appeared before **James D. Blackburn**, a Justice of the Peace in Warren County. She stated in her deposition that she is the full sister of Mrs. **Margaret Halsey**, widow of **Jno. Halsey** and formerly the widow of Captain **Daniel Cushing**. She was present when her sister and Daniel Cushing were married by her father at his house in New Jersey. In 1807 the family moved to Warren County and settled down in and near Lebanon except her father who died in Pittsburgh during their journey west. Subscribing witnesses were **William C. Lewis** and **Jno. V. H. Lewis**. At the same time, **Thomas R. Ross**, husband of **Mrs. Harriet Ross**, also gave a deposition stating that he had known **Margaret Halsey** and both of her deceased husbands since 1810, and that he had helped to bury both of them. <u>Bounty Land Warrant No. 18292</u> for 160 acres was issued under the Act of 1850 in favor of **Margaret Halsey** widow of **Daniel Cushing**, Captain United States Artillery War of 1812. She assigned the warrant to **Anthony H. Dunlevy** who was issued a patent for 160 acres in Wayne County, Iowa on 1 Aug 1854.
- On 17 Nov 1857, **Mrs. Margaret Halsey**, aged 83 years of Springfield, Clark County, Ohio, appeared before **James S. Christie**, a Justice of the Peace of Clark County for the purpose of obtaining a half-pay pension under the Act of 1853 and 1849. Margaret drew a widow's pension until 13 Jan 1819 when she was married to **John Halsey** in Lebanon by her brother-in-law, Reverend **Stephen Gard** of the Baptist church. **John Halsey** died near Lebanon in 1845. **Henry Bretney** and **James S. Halsey** of Clark County witnessed her signature. **Margaret Halsey** formerly Widow of Daniel Cushing was issued a "half pay" pension under the Act of 1853 at the rate of \$20 per month commencing on 3 Feb 1853 and continuing for five years by Certificate No. 6304 issued 16 Dec 1857. **R. M. Ros**s of Philadelphia included a cover letter for the application of his Aunt, Mrs. Margaret Halsey. He stated that the witnesses to the application were both born and raised at Lebanon, knew Mrs. Halsey 45 or 50 years and resided in Springfield since 1825 or 1826. He also indicated that **James S. Halsey** was not related to her husband, **John Halsey**.
- On 30 Aug 1858, **Mrs. Margaret Halsey**, aged 83, of Springfield, Clark County, Ohio, late of Warren County, gave a deposition before **James S. Christie**, a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of continuing her Half Pay pension under the Act of 1858. Her deposition was witnessed by **Henry Bretney** and **James Halsey**. Margaret was issued a pension under the Act of 1858 at the rate of \$20 per month commencing 3 Feb 1858.

We now know of about 95 pension files containing 3,213 pages that have been digitized for soldiers with a connection to Warren County.
