"EISSFELLER VORFAHREN - SEARCHING FOR GERTUD EISSFELLER AND HER ANCESTORS"

presented by Bob Rau Wednesday, September 21, 2016 at 7:30 PM in the Phillippi Meeting Room, the Campus Center at the Otterbein Retirement Community, 585 State Rte. 741 (north of Rte. 63), Lebanon.

This presentation is a case study of the search for a distant ancestor and extending her lines back three more generations in a small village in Hessen.

Robert 'Bob' Rau of Cincinnati, Ohio, has been interested in genealogy for over thirty years, and has been researching his and his wife's ancestral lines, all of which go back into Germany and Alsace-Lorraine. He has done extensive research in the microfilmed LDS records, and has been a non-member librarian, specializing in German research, at the LDS Family History Center in Cincinnati for over twenty years. He has made numerous trips to Germany and to Salt Lake City to further his research. Bob has made presentations on various aspects of German genealogy and Cincinnati and Southeastern Indiana German church history to adult education classes and to local, state and national genealogical societies. He was active in the microfilming of German Lutheran and Evangelical church records from Cincinnati and Southeastern Indiana, and is a member of numerous genealogical societies.

Michael Leslie Murray (February 10, 1946 - August 29, 2016)

"My dear cousin, Michael Leslie Murray, finally gave up his almost 15 month fight with stomach cancer. He died today, 29 August 2016. He was 70 years old. When first diagnosed last June, the doctors gave him 4 to 6 months. He was able to continue through another Christmas, celebrate his 70th birthday in February with a large family gathering, and live to celebrate his 50th Wedding Anniversary with his wonderful wife Nancy. He was also honored as a member of a First Family of Ohio through his mother, and an Early Settler of Warren County, Ohio, through his father. Both of those honors were very special to him and were accomplished with the tremendous help of Margaret Cheney at the Ohio Genealogical Society and the wonderful people at the Warren County, Ohio, Genealogical Society, as well as Joan Donovan at the Greene County, Ohio, Archives. Thanks so much to all of those people for helping him forget his illness for a little while, and enjoy the honor of having his many years of genealogical research result in those honors. JONATHAN WHITE OBITUARY, *Franklin (Ohio) Chronicle*, May 2, 1901

"Jonathan White was the son of Henry and Hannah Morris White. He was born at Red Bank, Monmouth County, New Jersey, on March 11, 1820. His father died when Mr. White was but an infant. His Mother brought him with his sister to Ohio in 1821 and located near Lebanon. Soon after his mother's death he came to the neighborhood of Carlisle.

He was united in marriage with Eleanor TenEyck, February 22, 1843. Eight children were born to them, four sons and four daughters. All the daughters and two sons survive to comfort their mother in her sorrow and loneliness. He closed his earthly life on Thursday, April 25th, 1901, at the rare and ripe age of 81 years, 1 month and 14 days.

Perhaps no man, not in public life or business, ever lived in this community who was more widely known than Mr. White. For eighty years he had lived in Warren County and had witnessed its transformation from a thickly wooded region to one of cultivated fields and beautiful homes. His own hands had their full share in this change.

Mr. White was a man, when in his prime and vigor, of splendid strength and great bodily endurance. He was a man of intuition and of quick perception of the motives that actuated men – not suspicious but always alert.

He was a just man and hated an injustice with all the intensity of a vigorous soul. He spurned hypocrisy and sham. He did not believe in the mere artificial belongings of the times. He had no short cuts to the accumulation of property. He was first vexed then pained by misplaced confidence. He had a kindly sympathy for the poor and unfortunate. Honesty was his pride. He sought by word and deed to inculcate the principle of fair dealing.

He lived on the farm near Franklin for 55 years and had removed to the suburb of Franklin but a few weeks before his death. His funeral was April 27, 1901, where a large number of his old friends and relatives assembled to pay tribute to his memory.

Services were conducted by Rev. B.F. Clayton assisted by Rev. C. D. Wilson."

War. Com. Pleas, Oct. Term 1828

Application for Naturalization

Personally appeared in open Court **William Henderson** an applicant for naturalization who on being duly sworn according to law depose and saith that he is twenty one years of age, that he was born in the County of Donnegal in Ireland, from whence in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, being then a minor under the age of twenty one years, to wit of the age of Eight years; he emigrated with his fathers family to the United States of America; that he now resides and has continued to reside in the United States to wit in Warren County in the State of Ohio, from the year Eighteen hundred and sixteen until the present time; and the said **William Henderson** saith that during the time he has resided in the United States, he has been attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; that it has been his bona fide intention for at least three years past to become a citizen of the United States, And he further saith upon his solemn oath that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty whatever and particularly he renounces all allegiance and fidelity to his majesty the King of Great Britain and Ireland to whom he was heretofore a subject; And the said William also saith that he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the order of nobility in any country whatever.
