*Rose Hill Cemetery*

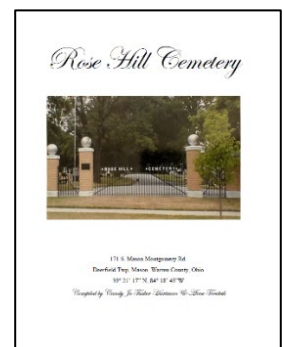
2022. Compiled by Candy Jo Tucker Hartman and Arne Trelvik.

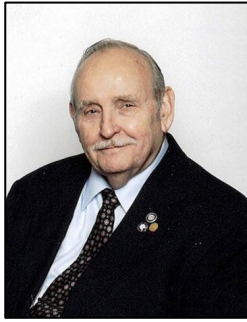

## NECROLOGY

With deep regret, we report that Thomas Robert Luce, longtime member of WCGS, passed away November 16, 2022. In 1988, Tom submitted 65 Pedigree Charts (L-18) that are included in the Ancestor Chart Collection in the WCGS Resource Library.



Thomas Robert Luce was born in Cincinnati Ohio on August 2, 1936. Tom was the son of Robert and Dorothy Luce (both deceased). He was married for 65 years to his beloved wife Barbara Ellen (Boykin) Luce. Tom and Barbara are parents of Thomas II (wife Nikki), Karen Church (husband Gerald), Steven Luce (deceased), and Diane Brauch (husband Wesley). Tom and Barbara have ten grandchildren: Brandon, Ryan, Gwendolyn, Dylan, Joshua, Kyle, Eric, Samantha, Joshua, Kristina and nine great-grandchildren.

Tom proudly served in the United States Marine Corps for an eight-year obligation. Tom was a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 212 for 63 years. He worked at various companies throughout his career as a Project Engineer, including American Can Company in Vernon California, Peco Corporation in Mountain View California, Reynold's Metals Company in Torrance California, Heekin Can Company in Cincinnati Ohio, and Ford Motor Company in Sharonville, Ohio. Tom retired from the Ford Motor Company in 2001 as an electrician in the Gears Department. Over the years Tom also taught many new union electricians in the IBEW Union apprenticeship program.

Tom spent much of his life pursuing his love of genealogy. He researched the Luce and Edwards family back to the Mayflower and beyond. He wrote and published numerous genealogy books detailing the facts he researched and discovered. Tom was also a founder of several DNA genealogy groups.

Tom was also a member of the Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, with eight proven patriots ([SAR National No. 114959](#)), Society of Mayflower Descendants, Bethel American Legion Lodge 61, and the Bethel Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons. ### JOHN MULLIN (MULLEN) – NEW FIRST FAMILIES ANCESTOR

Recently, my application was approved for First Families of Warren County, Ohio. Even though I grew up here, this was my first Warren County connection and the first area lineage society application I have had approved. The success with my application was due to a few specific things. First, having Jean Muetzel, current WCGS Lineage Societies Chair, and Candy Jo Tucker Hartman, former WCGS Lineage Societies Chair, provide advice and direction along the way was invaluable. Second, having easy access to a FamilySearch Affiliate Library (right here!) enabled me to access records needed to prove connections between generations that could not have been done otherwise. Third, having great WCGS Volunteers like Linda Eckert, Arne Trelvik, and Winston Cochran who patiently helped me find details about the family, land records, and other resources was icing on the cake.

John Mullin was born 7 Apr 1752 in Chester Township, Burlington County, New Jersey, then Colonial America. He first married Catherine Haines 25 Mar 1776 in Burlington County, New Jersey, and they had 13 known children together. Catherine was a descendant of John Haines, the first Governor of Connecticut. Following the death of Catherine 25 May 1798 in Frederick County, Virginia, John married Lydia Richards 9 Oct 1799 in the Crooked Run Meeting House in what is now Warren County, Virginia (then Frederick County). The family moved to Warren County, Ohio, around 1801 and all but one of the 12 known children they had together were born here. John Mullin is found in the 1806 Tax List for property in Range 5N, Township 2W, Section 9, in Clear Creek Township. He died 25 Jul 1843 and is buried in Springboro Hicksite Quaker Cemetery in Springboro, Warren County, Ohio.

One of the notable things about John Mullin is that he served as a Private from New Jersey in Captains Green's and Voorhees' Companies and Colonels Hendrickson's and Ogden's Regiments in the Revolutionary War ([DAR Patriot – Ancestor #A082720](#)) and as a Private in Captain David Sutton's Company of Colonel James Findlay's 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment of the Ohio Militia during the War of 1812, serving from April 27, 1812, until October 27, 1812.

Although John died in 1843, the documents proving his heirs did not show up until 1859, when a Petition to Partition the real estate property was filed. In addition to the initial Petition to Partition filed in April 1859, a Final Record was filed in September 1859. Both have good information to help identify his children and grandchildren. As a side note, there are 19 people or groups of people named as each having a 1/16<sup>th</sup> interest. There are 8 people named as having an interest in the 1/16<sup>th</sup> portion that would have gone to James Mullin, but each are listed as having a 1/7<sup>th</sup> interest. One of the sons of James Mullin, Daniel H. Mullin, is not listed at all.

James Mullin, son of John and Catherine (Haines) Mullin, was born 24 Jun 1779 while the family was still living in Virginia. James married Mary "Polley" Carter 9 Nov 1809 in Warren County, Ohio. James also served in the War of 1812, like his father, from Warren County under General William Henry Harrison. Around 1830 the family moved to Union County, Indiana. Mary died 7 Oct 1838, and James died 18 Sep 1839. Both James and Mary are buried in Old Dubois Cemetery in Harmony Township, Union County, Indiana. At the time of their death, three of their children were still minors. Guardianship records are not found until the May Term of 1843 for these children. Probate was settled in August 1843 in which the heirs of James Mullin are named.

Thomas Mullin was a son of James and Mary "Polley" (Carter) Mullin. He was born 2 Nov 1813 in Ohio, probably in Warren County, and died 14 Nov 1895 in Union County, Indiana. His dates of birth and death are proven through Bible Records found online at [Ancestry.com](#) (many thanks to Julie Wallace). Thomas married Amanda Greer, daughter of James and Agnes (Glidewell) Greer, 27 Jan 1843 in Union County, Indiana. Amanda was born about 1825 and died before the 1850 U.S. Federal Census was taken. She and an infant are listed on her mother's grave marker in Old Dubois Cemetery, but without any dates.

Census records were used to show the family of Thomas Mullin in 1850 and 1860, but it was a bit of a challenge to prove Amanda as the mother of Mary Elizabeth Mullin, my 2x Great Grandmother. Fortunately, Amanda's mother, Agnes (Glidewell) Greer was living with Thomas and his family in 1850. This led to the discovery of other children of hers and ultimately, to a will of Susan (Greer) Ryman in 1902. The will stated, *"One-tenth thereof to the children of my deceased sister Amanda Mullen, being Mrs. Mary Rue, and James Mullen and Jeremiah Mullen, in equal parts, share and share alike."* This helped prove the connection not only to Amanda, but one step further to Mary Elizabeth (Mullin) Rue.

Mary Elizabeth Mullin had been one of my brick walls for decades. Family rumor was that my 2x Great Grandmother, Mary Elizabeth (Mullin) Rue, was born in Indiana to parents who were both from Ireland. After years of searching, the key to breaking through that brick wall came in the form of an additional obituary I found for her that named a brother, James. This was the first clue to help me find her family. Now, not only have I found her family, but tracked them back not to Ireland, but Indiana, and then to Warren County!

If you have any interest in submitting an application for a lineage society, need help with your brick walls, or would like to get a more complete picture of your ancestors, please contact WCGS. In addition to those I named that helped me with my research, we have many excellent volunteers that can help you with yours.
