SEARCHING FOR ELIZABETH; DISCOVERING NORTHERN IRELAND

Wednesday October 17th, 7:30 PM in the Phillippi Meeting Room of the Campus Center at the Otterbein-Lebanon Retirement Community, 585 State Route 741 (north of State Route 63), Lebanon, Ohio.

Researching for Irish records can be overwhelming and frustrating. Like all immigrant research, the search starts with mining all the clues in US records first to help determine where to begin a search in Ireland before “jumping the pond” for records. More Irish records are becoming available online each day. Northern Ireland holds distinct and separate repositories from those in the Republic of Ireland. These archives are often overlooked when searching for Irish roots, particularly for records of Northern Ireland ancestors. Learn more about this beautiful part of the island with recent scenes of the Northern Ireland countryside and Belfast. Review some important Northern Ireland libraries and archives as well as British/UK websites you should consider exploring in your search for your Irish roots. Audience level: All

The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3. This phase will cover surnames from "Moore" through the letter Q. Pension files for men who served in Ohio Militia Units are now on line through the name **John Pawpaw**.

=>PRIVATE WILLIAM PATTON, WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE

[War of 1812 Pension and Bounty Land Warrant Application Files](#)," fold3.com, [William Patton](#) (19 images)

William Patton and **Christiana/Christina Ball**, both of lawful age, were married on 20 Apr 1811 in Warren County, Ohio by **Paul Lewis** Esq, Justice of the Peace. Christiana was the widow of **Calvin Ball** who died in 1808. **Christenia Patton** died 4 Aug 1832, aged 55 years & 9 months and was buried in the [Old School Baptist Church Cemetery](#) in Clearcreek Twp. On 22 Aug 1833 **William Patton** and **Nancy Insly** were married in Warren County, Ohio by **John C. Brook**. William and Nancy are found at Fairbanks Twp., Turmans Creek Post Office, in Sullivan County, Indiana in the 1850 census where William was living when filing his claims for bounty land and for a survivor's pension. The census lists William as a native of Virginia.

On 27 Apr 1812, **William Patton** was drafted at Warren County, Ohio for a term of 6 months in Capt. **David Sutton's Company** in Col. **James Findlay's** 2nd Regiment of Ohio Militia and was credited with serving 183 days to 26 Oct 1812. He was surrendered as a prisoner of war on 16 Aug 1812 in General Hull's surrender of Detroit and remained a prisoner until he was exchanged at the close of the war. At the time of being taken prisoner, he was under the command of 1st **Lieutenant Sweny**, as Capt. Sutton had been sent as bearer of dispatches to Chilicothe [sic] Ohio.

On 27 January 1851, **William Patton** aged 64 of Sullivan County, Indiana, made a declaration before **Samuel Myers**, a justice of the peace, for the purpose of obtaining bounty land under the Act of 1850. **Bounty Land Warrant No. 22890** for 80 acres was issued under the Act of 1850 in favor of William Patton, private in Capt. Sutton's Company, Ohio Militia War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to **James Lemay** who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Jasper County, Illinois on 10 Dec 1852.

On 5 Jul 1855, **William Patton** aged 68 of Sullivan County, Indiana, made a declaration before **William C. McBride**, a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of obtaining bounty land under the Act of 1855. His declaration was witnessed by **Benjamin V. Wible** and **William Wilson**. **Bounty Lane Warrant No. 35977** for 80 acres was issued under the Act of 1855 in favor of William Patton, Private Captain Sutton's Company, Ohio Militia, War 1812. He assigned the warrant to **Trigg T. Allen** who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Worth County, Missouri on 15 Nov 1858.

On 21 Mar 1871, **William Patton**, aged 85, a resident of Turmans Creek Post Office made a declaration before the Sullivan County, Indiana Clerk of Courts for the purpose of obtaining a survivor's pension under the Act of 1871 (Application No. 4963). He declared that he was married to Christina Ball in the spring of 1811 in Warren County, Ohio. **James A. Weir**, **William Magill**, **Thomas Wolfe** and **Richard E. Riggs** witnessed his declaration. William Patton was admitted to a pension under the Act of 1871 of \$8 per month commencing 14 Feb 1871 by Certificate #2399 dated 9 Aug 1871. The pension file does not list a final payment date or his second marriage to **Nancy Insly**.

We now know of about 100 pension files containing 3,338 pages that have been digitized for soldiers with a connection to Warren County.
