ALLEEN STEPHENSON DIGITAL NEWSPAPER PROJECT - WESTERN STAR UPDATE



Since the fall of 2018, our Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project, sponsored and maintained by the Warren County Genealogical Society, has provided free public access to digital images of the Western Star from 1807 through **1941** (YAY!) on the Ohio Memory Project. Through the 1st quarter of 2022 we have had **330,362 page views** by **14,589 users.** With the recent inclusion of more issues, we are looking forward to receiving the analytics for the 2nd quarter of this year.

Clues to Use

Warren County, Ohio, Veteran Grave Registration Cards on file at the Warren County Recorder's Office by Mary M. Everhart 2007

We would like to thank the Warren County Recorder's Office for preserving and maintaining the Veteran Grave Registration Card files and for providing ready access to the cards in order to abstract the data from them for this publication.

In 1933, the American Legion adopted a national veteran grave registration plan to help ensure that the grave of every deceased veteran was included in Memorial Day services. The Depression era Works Progress Administration "adopted" the project, researching each veteran, completing a Grave Registration Card, and preparing a plat of each cemetery showing the individual veteran gravesites. The cards were filed with the various County Recorders.

The earliest burial recorder on the cards at the Warren County Recorder's Office is that for Revolutionary War veteran, Joseph Parks (1746-1814) who is buried in Dicks Creek Cemetery in Franklin Township. The information contained on an individual card changed through the years. The card for Hiram Simonton, below, shows the detailed information recorded on the original cards.

The book is in our Resource Library for you to explore. It has 37,278 entries.

WCGS HOUSE HISTORIES COMMITTEE

The House Histories Committee has completed two houses and is working on a third. The first to be researched was the **Green Tree Inn**, built in 1832 by Ichabod Corwin, Jr., north of Lebanon and is a great example of an historic Ohio Inn on the stagecoach lines. This was chosen because the recent purchase of the land by Duke Energy made it uncertain if the house would remain on the property.

Our research includes property searches, research of architecture and floor plans, and extensive search of the owners of the property over the years.

The second house was a Maineville farmhouse on Route 48, familiarly known as the **Michel Farmhouse**, was built in 1838. The house plan was typical of many prominent farms in our area and included the raising of cattle that were exported to Venezuela, Mexico, Honduras, and Costa Rica. Later it operated as the Green Hills Dairy Farm for many years. The property is being sold and the original house will likely be torn down.

The third property in downtown Mason was built as a personal residence in the Second Empire style in 1873, and later converted into **The Modern Hotel** in 1911, providing boarding by the week, day, or meal. Improvements included a furnace and radiators replacing fireplaces in each room, larger window replacements, water system to pump water to storage tank in attic and gravity flowed to sink, and a speakeasy in the basement.

This historic building has a story to tell as the location of an unsolved murder in 1901 and reported ghost sightings. It is currently a restaurant, Thai Terrace.

RICHARD H. STRINGFELLOW OBITUARY

"Richard Henry Stringfellow was born February 10, 1839, at Roseville, Muskingum county, Ohio, and died July 29, 1912 at Morrow, Ohio.

He was married to Ann Keiger at Wilmington, Ohio. He lived with her about six years when she departed from this life. He was married again in 1872 to Miss Hester Ann Reeder of Waynesville. She bore him three children, Thomas R., Maggie I., and Edward G., who are all living. She died in October 1882. He was married again March 12, 1883 to Mrs. Mary Jane Stevens at Morrow, Ohio, who survives him.

He served his country as a soldier in the Civil War. He enlisted September 12, 1861 and was mustered into service at Camp Chase September 19, '86' A private in Captain David H. Miller's Company I 31st Regiment of the Ohio Volunteer Infantry for three years. He fought in the following battles: Corinth, Miss., April 30, '62; Trinity Ala., July 24, '62; Perrysville, Ky., October 8, '62; Stone River, Tenn., December 31, '62; to January 2 '63; Rosecran's campaign June 23 to 30, '62; Hoover's Yap, Tenn., July 24, '63; and Chicamauga, September 19-20, '63 where he was sounded in the right side and arm. He was transferred to the Veteran Relief Corp. February 15, 1864 by order of the War Department where he served until he was honorably dismissed September 18, 1864.

He had been a member of the Samuel Steven G. A. R. post No. 353 and was a member of the I. O. O. F. fraternity. He was a kind and loving father and a devoted husband"

- Richard Stringfellow filed for an invalid pension on 15 Mar 1865 for service in Company I, 31st OVI and in Company A, 11th Regt, Veteran Reserve Corps (Application No. 63464, Certificate No. 74127).
- His wife filed for a widow's pension on 12 Aug 1912 (Application No. 991660, Certificate No. 755846)
