

FAMILYSEARCH EXTENDS FULL-TEXT SEARCH

In early June, <u>FamilySearch</u> announced they are extending their powerful AI-based Full-Text Search to include their Catalog and All-Collections search, giving their users greater access to previously hard-to-find records. Although still under development, the Full-Text Search function, which uses AI to create searchable transcripts of hand-written documents, is one of the most powerful tools currently available to genealogy researchers, and it is free! FamilySearch has been adding more records to Full-Text Search at an amazing pace, so if you haven't tried it lately, I encourage you to give it another try. 

NATIONAL ARCHIVES GENEALOGY FAIRS & SERIES

The depth and breadth of records held at the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) is incredible, but there can be challenges and expenses associated with accessing those records. Since 2013 the National Archives has provided an annual series of unique and interesting presentations, with handouts, that can be viewed on YouTube free of charge. I watched their presentation "Revealing Ties to Espionage in the Office of Strategic Services Records" during which they presented a history of the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) and discussed the types of records available (and not available) to researchers. By searching their indexes, you may discover someone in your tree with a secret history as a World War II American spy! These are records from churches <u>outside</u> of Hamilton County, Ohio, which were previously completed in a separate set of indexes. 
Select Shop & Support from the left menu bar, and then Filter by Category for either Baptism Records or Marriage Records. The new publications appear at the top of the lists.

THE NEWEST DNA TOOL FOR ANCESTRY PRO TOOLS USERS



If you subscribe to Ancestry Pro Tools, look for this *NEW* feature the next time you view your DNA matches. (This feature is in Beta and not all users will have immediate access.)



While using the Pro Tools Shared Matches feature has been a game changer, Auto Cluster is another useful tool available on other sites, but previously lacking on Ancestry. For now, it will only work on matches who share 65cM to 1300cM with you, but is anticipated to work with lower amounts by the end of the year.

The tool groups matches that share at least 20cM with each other. These are likely to share a common ancestor. When I used it on my matches, I was immediately able to see five obvious groups: Henderson, Sundin, Duncan, Pruitt, Bowman / Fitzwater. There were also a multitude of the "grey" blocks, indicating the people who could not be placed into just one group since they matched people in different groups. There is a good amount of pedigree collapse in my tree, and I have used other clustering tools, so this was not a surprise to me.



Below the grid, it gives you drop-down menus for the different clusters. When you click on one of the drop-down menus, the display only shows the selected cluster, helping to reduce the visual clutter. You also have the option to only display Maternal or Paternal (which may show Parent 1 and Parent 2 if you have not designated which is which yet). All in all, I will be spending more time with this tool to see if it can help with some of the many DNA mysteries I am currently tackling. Let me know if you try it and what you think!

WESTERN STAR ANALYTICS AND SUPPORT THE STAR! UPDATE



Since the fall of 2018, our **Alleen Stephenson Digital Newspaper Project**, sponsored and maintained by the Warren County Genealogical Society, has provided free public access to digital images of *The Western Star* from 1807 through 2001 on the Ohio Memory Project. With the addition of issues through 2001, there are now well over **160,000** pages online, with more in the digitization process. As of the end of June 2025, **52,972** users have viewed **926,753** page views in **76,662** sessions. It seems incredible we are nearing ONE MILLION page views!

In July 2024 we started our <u>Support the Star!</u> fundraising campaign with a goal of raising \$20,000 by July 4, 2025. Thank you to all who have donated, both money and past issues, to our campaign. We just received a significant grant from the <u>City of Lebanon's Civic Donation Program</u> through the <u>Warren County Foundation</u> and want to extend a special note of appreciation to them. Although we did not reach our goal of \$20,000, we did raise \$15,205.09! We will continue our fundraising efforts and continue to digitize and add even more pages and issues of this newspaper online, providing FREE access to all.

The Warren County Records Center & Archives located and posted the image of the front page (shown above) of the July 1, 1897, issue on social media. NEW YORK STATE HISTORIC NEWSPAPERS

One of our outstanding volunteers directed me to the New York State Historic Newspapers website, a joint project of the Northern New York Library Network and the Empire State Library Network, which "contains 1,469,194 issues, comprising 14,905,954 pages." Although I do not know how much of their digitized content is unique to their collection, I have found their website to be easy to use, and it adds another free tool for your research! You can conduct your first search right on their home page, or you can look at the tabs above the map of New York to learn more about their collection and the dates available.

Their earliest issue is February 28, 1725! This is, of course, an excellent resource for searching your New York ancestors, but a search for Warren County, Ohio, returned over 90 results and a search for Lebanon, Ohio, returned more than 311 results. Their search function also allows the use of wildcards, which is very helpful. Be patient, I have found the search function can take up to about 20 seconds to produce the results. But once you've found your results, the site provides quick and easy options to clip and save the articles. You will find their website here: https://www.nyshistoricnewspapers.org/
