"100th Anniversary of the 1913 Flood as it cut through the Franklin/Carlisle area of Warren County, Ohio"

7:30 PM Wednesday, 20 Mar 2013, Phillippi Meeting Room of the Campus Center at the Otterbein Retirement Community, 585 N State Rte 741 (north of Rte 63), Lebanon, Ohio.

Harriet Foley, local historian, and a member of the 1913 flood Commemoration Committee, will talk about the 1913 flood as it came down the Great Miami river from Chautauqua, through the Carlisle area, and the west side of Franklin. Then she will discuss why the east side (or downtown area) was not as damaged because that ground is higher. She will bring at least one of the archived photo albums, and Tom Foley's map showing the Carlisle Cut-off of the New York Central Railroad. *The 1913 Flood in Franklin, Ohio: A Finding Guide* with reproductions of flood photos found at the Harding Museum will soon be available. Following her presentation, Harriet will have copies of the book for sale at \$20.

NEW BOOK! WARREN COUNTY, OHIO, FUNERAL RECORDS VOLUME 4: HOSKINS FUNERAL HOMES.

Thanks to the efforts of a host of society volunteers, this 262 page book is now available. It contains records of 15,411 funerals that were extracted from 44 volumes of records from the Oswald Hoskins Funeral Home (1867-1980) and the Vale Hoskins Funeral Home (1932-1992). As available each entry contains the name of the deceased, date of death, date of funeral and the volume and page where the complete funeral record may be found. The place of burial/cremation is included for 5,908 of the records and military service information is provided for 728 of the entries. Photocopies of all 44 volumes of the records are available at our resource library. The amount of information available for a particular funeral is minimal for early records but can contain very detailed family information in the more recent entries.

The book may be purchased from the Warren County Genealogical Society for \$25 plus \$3.00 shipping and handling. Ohio residents please add 6 ½% sales tax. Our series of 4 volumes of Funeral Home Records have information on 49,497 funerals. More are coming soon.

=> Clem Reid/Reed (c1842-1920), 1st Class Cabin Boy, U.S.S. Silver Cloud

Clem Reid/Reed was born in Charlottesville, Albemarle County, Virginia, the slave of a James Bell. He became a "contraband" during the Civil War, enlisting on 28 Sep 1863 at Ft. Pillow Tenn. as "1st Boy" in the US Navy. He was assigned to the tinclad U.S.S. Silver Cloud which served on the Mississippi and White Rivers during the war. In Aug or Sept 1864, the ship came under fire from Confederate infantry troops on shore. During the engagement, Clem's job was to help in running a starboard gun forward when firing and pulling it back when loading. During this engagement he received an injury in his right eye and eventually went blind in that eye. He continued to serve until the end of the war and was mustered out 8 Jun 1865 at Mound City, Illinois.

Clem Reid filed for and received an invalid pension for total blindness in his right eye while living in Lebanon, Ohio (Application #7230, Certificate #6414). If you subscribe to www.fold3.com you may see his 231 page pension file at http://www.fold3.com/image/#1/32581971. Vision in his left eye also deteriorated but numerous claims for an increased pension were rejected as not being war related. In 1913 congress passed a special act on his behalf which increased his \$12 pension to \$30 per month. He first married Eliza Crockett in Highland County. She died 19 Jul 1887 in Lebanon and is buried in an unmarked grave at Lebanon Cemetery. They had two children, Mary born 2 Apr 1877 & Florence, born 7 May 1883. Clem married his second wife, Millie Williams on 21 Jul 1892 in Covington, Ky. They wound up in Miami County, Ohio and apparently lived there until he entered the National Military Home in 1908, totally blind. He died at the home in 1920 and is buried in the Dayton National Cemetery, Section 2 Row 14 Site 2. Millie was living in Piqua, Ohio at the time of his death.
