I will be sitting beside you (virtually) during the entire conference. This is the kickoff for a whole calendar of upcoming events!

Lastly, a word of caution. While I firmly believe FamilySearch's Full-Text search is the best advancement in genealogical research in years, I must admit it has made me lazy. For over a year, I have been searching for proof of a father-son relationship in my ancestral tree and hoping eventually I would find that record by using Full-Text Search. A week ago, I tried searching online using a different, yet proven strategy. A Google search query took me directly to a FamilySearch.org Dutch Reformed Church record in New Jersey that contained my ancestor's 1790 baptismal entry. The record is in the FamilySearch catalog, but not yet included in Full-Text Search. Keep searching, keep learning, and don't forget the basics.

DISCHARGE CERTIFICATES ON THE WC RECORDER'S WEBSITE

Since the Civil War, Veterans have visited their County Courthouse to record their military discharge papers for safekeeping. Their discharge papers were proof of an honorable discharge and necessary to prove eligibility for benefits, and the Court copy served as a backup if the original were lost.

Recently, the Warren County Recorder made these records available online!

Similar to the Laredo system available in our Resource Library, the Warren County Recorder's Office has "AVA" for online research. Start by reading and clicking Accept on the Welcome page of the [Public Records Search](#). Then type the name of the ancestor you are searching for in the top two boxes of the form. In my example, I used Bercaw, Carl.

In the Document Types box, type "VETERAN LEGACY" without the quotation marks. If you are having trouble finding records, try using the Document Type and just the surname, or a variation of the surname spelling, as spelling can throw off some searches.



Once you get the results of your search, click the line with the results to open the information for that line.



Click on the document icon (it looks like a piece of paper).



A copy of the discharge certificate will appear. At the bottom of the page are various options including zoom, print, and page forward or back if the record consists of multiple pages. If you click the Printer icon, it will give you Print Options. To save the document to your computer, either print or save to PDF once the Print Dialog window opens.

Said John B. Bowman was born in Warren County in the State of Ohio, a 24 years of age, six feet 6 inches high, Light complexion, Light eyes, Dark hair, and by occupation, when enlisted, farmer

OATH OF IDENTITY.

John B. Bowman of the town of Richwood, County of Warren, in the State of Ohio, on the 27th day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty one personally appeared before me the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace for the county and State above mentioned, John B. Bowman, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical John B. Bowman who was a Sergeant in the Company commanded by Captain John L. Kelly in the Regiment O. V. I. commanded by Col. B. Smith that he enlisted on the 31st day of August 1861 for the term of three years, and was discharged at Atlanta, Georgia on the 3rd day of October 1864, by reason of Expiration of term of service and subscribed before me the day and year above written.

From Carl Bercaw's WWI discharge certificate, we find he was born around 1896 in Monroe, Ohio; he enlisted or was drafted on April 25, 1918, in Middletown, Ohio; he was shipped overseas on June 6, 1918; and he served in France, Italy, Dalmatia and Montenegro. He participated in the Battle of Nittorio Veneto, October 24-November 4, 1918, and in the expedition into Montenegro, January 6-January 27, 1919. Carl served in Company L, 331st (Infantry Regiment) and in Company F, 332nd (Infantry Regiment). Carl was never AWOL and was in good health. He returned to the U.S. on April 15, 1919, and on May 3, 1919, at Camp Sherman (near Chillicothe), Ohio, he received travel pay to Middletown, Ohio, a \$60 bonus and his Honorable Discharge certificate.

In another, yet completely different example, on October 1, 1864, Sgt. John B. Bowman was discharged from Company E, 17th Regiment of Ohio Volunteer Infantry, at Atlanta, Georgia, after completing his enlistment obligations. John, a farmer by trade, had enlisted in the Army on October 31, 1861, to serve a three-year enlistment. John was 24 years old, was born in Warren County, Ohio, and stood six foot tall with a light complexion and dark hair. On December 26, 1866, John Bowman appeared before James Ferguson, a Justice of the Peace, to swear he was the same John Bowman who was a Sergeant in the 17th O.V.I. and had been discharged at the end of his term of service. He was presented with his discharge certificate by James S. Totten, Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for Warren County, Ohio. His Veteran Legacy record is SD2-142.

These papers provide a wealth of information for genealogists searching for details to help write the stories of their ancestors' lives.




