The Turtle Creek Chapter NSDAR was organized in Lebanon, Ohio in 1926 by Organizing Regent, Miss Charlotte Washburn French along with 12 organizing members: Blanche Callon, Edith Harris, Grace King, Margaret McCain, Emma March, Ladora Owens, Roberta Pauly, Lida Seigle, Lucia Shawhan, Rosalie Van Doren, Mary Van Doren and Sarah Williams. The organization of the chapter was confirmed by the National Society in 1927.

The public is welcome to attend a dedication ceremony at 10:00 AM on Saturday, May 11, 2019 to honor Miss French with the placement of a bronze DAR marker at her grave in Section B Lot 333 of the Lebanon Cemetery.

The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3 and has Ohio pension files on line up to the name **Samuel Quinn**.

Previously, pension files were located for the following Warren County soldiers:

Pvt. [James Perrine](#) (1773-1864) in Capt. Daniel Kain's Company Oho Militia (20 pages)

HELP: I originally thought this was the James Perrine (1786-1872) buried in [Fellowship Cemetery](#) but a review of the pension file shows the James Perrine who served Capt. Kain's Company was from Clermont County. Can anyone provide information on any War of 1812 service by the James Perrine (1786-1872) who is buried in the [Fellowship Cemetery](#)?

PETER S. PRICE (1790 - 1861) WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE

[War of 1812 Pension and Bounty Land Warrant Application Files](#)," fold3.com, [Zachariah Prater](#) (20 pages)

Peter Price of lawful age and **Jane Alexander** by consent of her father were issued Marriage License No. 113 in Warren County, Ohio on 10 Jun 1812. They were married on 18 Jun 1812 in Warren County by **Rev. Rusk** but there is no record of the marriage being recorded in Warren County. In 26 Jul 1871, **Hester Byan** and **Martin Byan** of New Richmond, Clermont County, testified to confirm the marriage of Peter and Jane Price.

On 11 Aug 1812 **Peter Price** volunteered at Sycamore Twp., Hamilton County in Captain **Luther Leonard's** Company in Colonel **Sutton's** Regiment of Ohio Militia for a term of 6 months and was present for Hull's surrender of Fort Detroit on 16 Aug 1812. He served for 185 days and was honorably discharged at St. Mary's, Ohio on 11 Feb 1813. He was taken sick and sent home and remained sick during the remainder of his 6 months.

On 20 Oct 1851 **Peter S. Price**, aged 61, of Hamilton County, made a declaration before the Mayor of Cincinnati for the purpose of obtaining Bounty Land under the Act of 1850. [Bounty Land Warrant No. 781](#) for 80 acres was issued in favor of Peter S. Price, Private Captain Leonard's Company Colonel Suttons Regiment Ohio Volunteer Militia War of 1812. He assigned the Warrant to **John W. Day** who was issued a patent for 92.36 acres in DeWitt and Piatt Counties, Illinois on 1 Mar 1854.

On 3 Apr 1855, **Peter S. Price**, aged 65 of Hamilton County, made a declaration before **James J. Ross**, a Justice of the peace, for the purpose of obtaining Bounty Land under the Act of 1855. [Bounty Land Warrant No. 9553](#) for 80 acres was issued in favor of Peter S. Price, Private in Captain Leonard's Company Ohio Militia War of 1812. He assigned the Warrant to Jacob P. T. Miller who was issued a patent for 80 acres in Taylor County, Iowa on 1 Jul 1859.

On 17 Aug 1861 **Peter Price** died in Sycamore Twp., Hamilton County, Ohio. **John A. Price** and **Sarah A. Price** of Sharonville, testified that they were present at his death.

On 22 Jul 1871, **Jane Price**, aged 82, of Sycamore Township (Sharonville PO) made a declaration before **H. H. Tinker**, Hamilton County Common Pleas Court Clerk, for the purpose of obtaining a widow's pension under the Act of 1871. **John A. Price** & **Sarah A. Price** witnessed "her mark". On 22 Aug 1871 Jane Price was admitted to a pension of \$8 per month commencing 14 Feb 1871 by Certificate No. 357 dated 24 Aug 1871. There is no record of her death in the pension file.
