Complete pension files are now on line for widow certificate numbers up to about 148,100 as has been the case since September, 2015.

=>**Marietta M. (Allen) Carpenter, widow of Joseph B. Carpenter, Co H, 79th OVI [80 images]**

Joseph P. (or B.) Carpenter was born about 1834 in Pennsylvania and was married in Warren County to **Marietta Allen** by **John W. Mason** on 18 Aug 1859. **Marietta M. “Mary Etta” Allen** was born on 22 Aug 1837 in Spring Valley, Greene County to **David Allen** and **Rachael Hawkins**. In 1860, Joseph and Marietta were living on their farm in Washington Twp. with their only son Nathan. **Nathan Henry Carpenter** was delivered on 26 May 1860 by Dr. **Edwin Headley** who later attested to the delivery.

Joseph enrolled for a term of 3 years on 4 Aug 1862 at Harveysburg, Ohio as a Private in Co. H, 79th OVI along with many other men from Warren County. He was killed in action near Resaca, Georgia on 15 May 1864. Joseph is buried at [Chattanooga National Cemetery](#), Section L, Site 9162.

On 27 Aug 1864, **Marietta Carpenter**, age 27 of Massie Twp. (Oregon Post Office), made a declaration before Judge **John C. Dunlevy** in the Warren County Probate Court for the purpose of obtaining a widow's pension under the Act of 1862 (Application #63609). She was admitted to a pension of \$8 per month commencing 15 May 1864 by Certificate #35985 dated 3 Jan 1865. A certificate dated 11 May 1868 added a sum of \$2 per month for son **Nathan Carpenter** under the Act of 1868 until his 16th birthday. Marietta was last paid \$8 to 4 Mar 1882.

Marietta Carpenter forfeited her widow's pension when she was married to **William S. Wills** in Waynesville, Ohio by **E. Burdsall**, M.E. Church minister, on 11 Mar 1882. She was living in Ridgeville in 1884. She was granted a divorce from **William Wills** and had her name restored to **Marietta M. Carpenter** at Lebanon on 31 Mar 1902

On 10 Apr 1902, **Marietta M. Carpenter**, aged 64 of Harveysburg, made a declaration before **Wit Merritt**, a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of having her name restored to the pension rolls as a remarried widow under the Act of 1901. She declared that she had no real or personal property and no income aside from the proceeds of her daily labor as a housekeeper at the rate of \$1.50 per week. She was admitted to a widow's pension of \$12 per month commencing 11 Apr 1902.

Marietta M. Carpenter was last paid \$50 to 4 Dec 1928 and dropped from the rolls due to her death on 19 Dec 1928 in Dayton at the age of 91. She was buried 21 Dec 1928 in [Miami Cemetery](#), Section N Lot 40 in Corwin, Ohio.

Witness included **John and Eliza J. Chenoweth**, **Nathan Keever**, **Ithamar Johnson**, **Sarah Rich**, **Mary S. Haines**, **John D. Cleaver** (age 82) of Harveysburg, **W. H. Cleaver** (age 72), **Mary J. Cleaver** (age 64) of Harveysburg, **A. H. Anson** (age 54) of Harveysburg, **Charles H. Eulass** (age 61) of Lebanon, **Frank M. Hamilton** (age 56) of Lebanon, and **Charles E. King** (age 39) of Lebanon.

The digitization of War of 1812 pension files continues on fold3. This phase will cover surnames from "Moore" through the letter Q. Pension files for men who served in Ohio Militia Units are now on line through the name **Matthew Patten**.

=>**PRIVATE LEWIS D. PARIS, (1796-1881) WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE**

Lewis Paris was born 20 Aug 1796 in New Jersey. He married to **Sarah W. Langley** on 22 May 1817 at Deerfield, Cumberland County, N. J. Sarah died about 1856 at their home near Oregon Post Office in Warren County. Lewis was married to his second wife, **Mercie "Mercea" H. Crone**, by Rev. **Jessie Botkin** of the M. E. church at Genntown, Warren County on 25 Aug 1863. Mercie was 1st married to **Nathan D. Howe** M.D. about 1824 who died 25 Aug 1860. Lewis died at his home on 15 Nov 1881 at Turtlecreek Twp., near Oregon Post office. Mercie died 2 Jan 1887. Lewis and Mercie were buried in the Olive Branch Cemetery two or three miles east of Lockport. **M. Oswald** was the undertaker.

Lewis Paris was drafted for a term of six months at Deerfield, Cumberland County, New Jersey as a Private in Captain **Benoni Dare's** Company in Col. **Joshua L. Howell's** 2nd Regiment New Jersey Militia on 26 Sep 1814. He declared that *"His company was stationed on the Delaware River in the old Revolutionary Camp Ground called Billings Post we lay there about 3 months & were ordered down on the bay shore after a march of three days we reached Port Elisabeth & encamped We remained there until the weather set in extremely cold when the waters became frozen & the enemy who lay off in the bay set sail & left We were then marched back to Bridgeton & gave up our arms."* He served for 83 days and was honorably discharged 17 Dec 1814 at Bridgetown/Bridgeton, New Jersey.

On 18 Jan 1851, **Lewis Paris**, aged 55, of Warren County, made a declaration before Justice of the Peace **Benjamin Blackburn** for the purpose of obtaining Bounty Land under the Act of 1850. [Bounty Land Warrant #23167](#) for 40 acres was issued in favor of **Lewis Paris**, Private in Captain Dares Company New Jersey Militia War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to **Thomas J. Kinnaman** who was issued a patent for 40 acres in Clay County, Illinois on 1 May 1854

On 31 Mar 1855, **Lewis Paris**, aged 59, of Warren County, made a declaration before George W. Frost, a notary public, for the purpose of obtaining additional Bounty Land under the Act of 1855. [Bounty Land Warrant #20206](#) for 120 acres was issued under the Act of 1855 in favor of **Lewis Paris**, a private in Captain Dare's Company of New Jersey Militia War of 1812. He assigned the warrant to **Andrew G. McBurney** who was issued a patent on 3 Jul 1857 for 120 acres in Cass County, Iowa.

On 15 Apr 1871, **Lewis Paris**, aged 71, of Oregon, Warren County, Ohio, made a declaration before **Wm. H. Rockhill**, clerk of Common Pleas Court, for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the Act of 1871. **Lewis Paris** was admitted to a Survivors' Pension of \$8 per month commencing 14 Feb 1871 by Certificate #6284 dated 13 Oct 1871. He was last paid \$8 to 4 Sep 1881 and dropped from the rolls for "failure to claim pension".

On 28 Nov 1881 **Mercie H. Paris**, aged 74, of Turtlecreek Twp., Oregon P.O. made a declaration before **Joseph O'Neill**, Warren County Probate Judge, for the purpose of obtaining a widows' pension under the Act of 1878. **Mercie H. Paris** was awarded a Widows' Pension of \$8 per month commencing 16 Nov 1881 by Certificate #32468 dated 19 Jun 1882. She was last paid \$12 to 4 Dec 1886 and was dropped from the rolls due to her death on 2 Jan 1887.

The inconsistent use of the middle initials for both Lewis and Mercie plus the spelling of Mercie as Mercea in the record of her marriage to Lewis resulted in numerous documents to prove that she was Lewis' widow. Witnesses and affiants included **Ephraim Sellers** of Broadway Street Lebanon, **Lot Wright** of Main Street Lebanon, **Thomas J. Howe** of Warren County [Mercie's son], **Alice M. Bean** of Lebanon [daughter of Rev. **Jesse Botkin** and Mercie's granddaughter], **Thomas C. Kersey** M.D., **S. A. Chamberlin**, **David P. Tichenor**, **William B. Blackburn**, **Maurice H. Oswald** (bookkeeper for J. N. Oswald) and **Frank Sherwood**.

=>PRIVATE JOHN NORTON, WAR OF 1812 PENSION FILE

On 8 Mar 1813, Surgeon **Hugh Stanard** declared him unfit for duty at Camp Meigs at the foot of the Miami Rapids.

On 27 Aug 1814 at Lebanon, Ohio, Capt. **Daniel Cushing** certified that **John Norton** sustained a rupture while doing hard labor in building the artificers buildings at Franklinton, Ohio in the winter of 1813.

On 20 Oct 1814 **John Norton** of Warren County, Ohio petitioned the US Senate and House of Representatives for a pension as he "*still continues unable to gain subsistence by manual labor which is the only dependence for himself and a large family*"

He was awarded a half pay pension of \$2.50 per month to commence from 11 May 1813, the time of his discharge.

In 1910 Mrs. **Frances H. Johnson** requested a copy of John Norton's pension file.

He was in the USAF and sat in on the conferences, while recording the talks, with General Maxwell Taylor - to end the war. There is a monument in front of the State Highway Bldg. on State Route 731 to honor his family and a monument in the little cemetery on the corner of Otterbein land to honor his direct ancestor [Francis Bedle] for serving in the Revolution."
